Community Profile – Marion, North Carolina

Marion, the county seat of McDowell County, lies in the scenic foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. With about 7,500 residents in the city and around 45,000 in the county, Marion blends small-town character with regional influence. The area offers mountain recreation, historic charm, and a close-knit community life. Lake James State Park is 15 minutes from Marion, the Blue Ridge Parkway is less than 45 minutes, Biltmore Estate is 45 minutes, and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park is a 2-hour drive.

Demographics & Economy

McDowell County's population is predominantly White non-Hispanic with small Black and Hispanic communities. Major employment sectors include healthcare, manufacturing, education, retail, and public administration. Wages are lower than in urban centers, yet local industries and the community college offer steady employment opportunities. 26% of the workforce commutes outside of McDowell County.

Education & Workforce

McDowell County Public Schools serve Marion and McDowell County. There are eight elementary schools, two middle schools, a STEM-focused middle school, and three options for high school: McDowell High School, the McDowell Early College, and a STEM-focused high school, McDowell Academy for Innovation. There are some private schools. McDowell Technical Community College provides workforce training, adult education, and associate degrees leading to four-year degrees at regional universities.

Religious & Social Landscape

Faith remains a central part of community life. Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian, and other non-denominational Protestant churches are prevalent.

Founded in 1862, First Baptist Church of Marion (FBC Marion) is a vibrant, multi-generational congregation rooted in a rich history of faith and service. Our church family includes approximately 150 active members, with an average Sunday attendance of 105.

We are located on North Main Street in the heart of Marion, North Carolina—a warm, growing community nestled in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains and just 30 miles east of Asheville, North Carolina. Our downtown setting positions us to be a visible and active presence in the life of our community.
